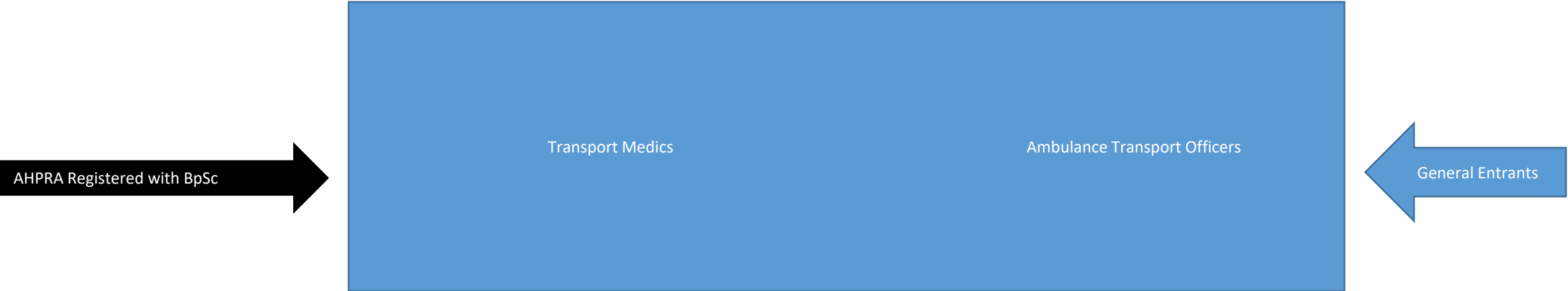
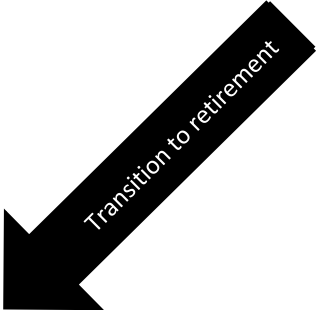
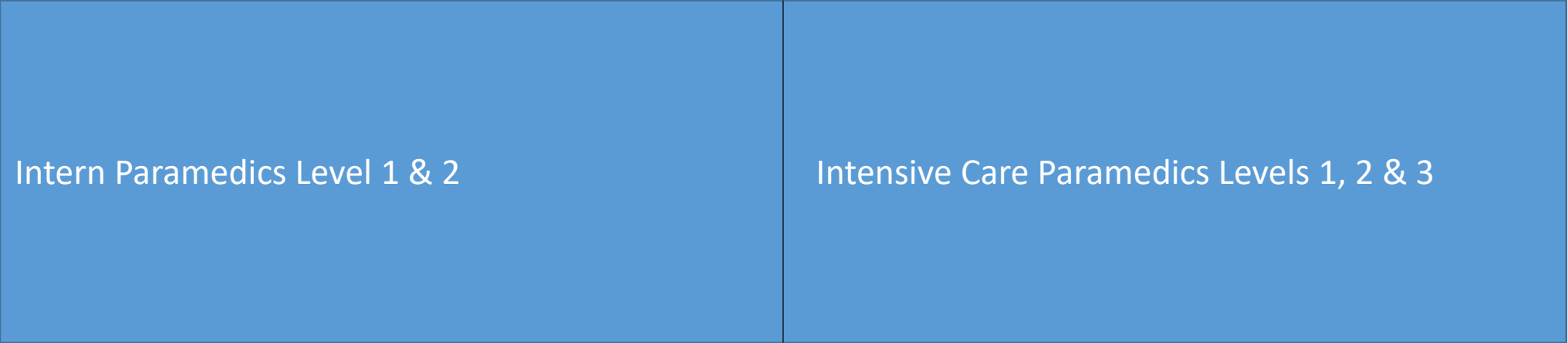

## Transport Medic (TM )

### Requirements

- Possess Bachelor of Paramedical Science Degree or equivalent.
- Current registration with APHRA Board of Australia.
- Hold a current unrestricted WA MDL.

### Scope of Practise

- Attend, treat and monitor patient of low to medium acuity as required by St John Ambulance WA for varied Health partners and calls within the community.
- This includes Inter Hospital P2 transfers and community P3 and (clinically reviewed) P2 calls.
- Skills and medications to be commensurate with requirements to deliver service to appropriate calls.
- Requirement to be able to work as either a hybrid crew of Medic/ATO or Medic/Medic configuration as directed.

## Ambulance Transport Officer (ATO)

### Requirements

- Possess normal employment requirements
- Hold a current unrestricted WA MDL
- Attend training induction when required to gain employment

### Scope of Practise

- Deliver a high quality of service to the public of Western Australia and Health partners.
- This may include non urgent clinical calls and possibly attending low acuity calls in the community.
- Requirements to be able to work as part of a team which may comprise, ATO /ATO, hybrid Medic/ATO or single ATO for clinical appointments.

# Clinical Interventions

- Provide Appropriate Model of Care within the Clinical Practice Guidelines of St John Ambulance WA.

## Permitted Intervention :

- ❖ Interhospital ECG/IV monitored transfer/pumps
- ❖ IM/IN/Oral - Drug/pain relief intervention
- ❖ ECG monitored Patients
- ❖ BLS interventions
- ❖ Stand by P1 Cardiac Arrest Community Intervention

## Restricted Intervention :

- ❖ Intravenous Cannulation/Intraosseous
- ❖ Advanced Airway Including iGel
- ❖ Chest Decompression
- ❖ P1 Response including interhospital transfers
- ❖ P2 Sedated patients requiring airway management/ transfer
