A Radio Dispatcher manages the emergency response fleet across the Metro and Country Radio Networks. Led by the RTM you will work with the dispatch team, using initiative and critical thinking skills to ensure the community are attended to with an appropriate and timely response. You will be trained to utilise best practice dispatch process to achieve KPI'S.

Radio Dispatch will be trained in a staged approach.

Completion of both stage 1 Country Radio and stage 2 Metro
Radio are required to be deemed qualified.

Prerequisites

Qualified Country Support Officer Completed 100 shifts over a minimum of 6 months

Maintain individual 000 call performance at or above the Agency Cumulative Performance value for a period of 3 months

COURSE STRUCTURE

CONTINUED EDUCATION

- Seek feedback from others on opportunities for development including Managers and C-RTM (where appropriate)
- Complete geographical worksheet and revise maps on <u>Connect</u>
- Keep relevant SOC qualifications current and up to date

Stage 1 - Country

- 48-hour Training Course
- 40 hours mentoring with a RD-M over a minimum of 10 shifts completing mentor OCL.
- Final Theory and Practical Assessments

Stage 2 – Metro (After min 12 weeks CRD)

- 96-hour Training Course
- 60 hours mentoring with a RD-M over a minimum of 12 shifts completing mentor OCL.
- Final Theory and Practical Assessments

Radio Dispatchers must complete the following annually

- Radio Dispatch CEP LMS Module
- 2-hour trainer observation

QUALIFICATION

- Radio Dispatch Certificate
- Claimable Allowance
